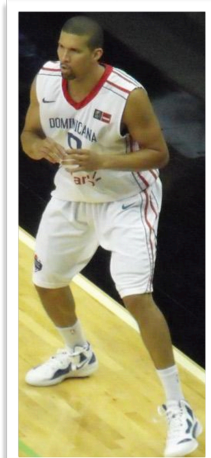

Whether you're a beginner or have experience, all skill levels are welcome. Join us for fun, friendship, and growth on the court. Let's make this season unforgettable! See you there!

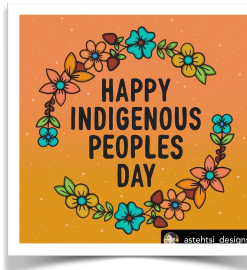
